During the months of April, May and June, 100 women making up 15 teams will work collectively toward raising \$65,000 in support of the renovation project costs. The womenled teams will work together to completely renovate the 1,232-square-foot home to be energy efficient.

Women Build is an initiative of Habitat for Humanity of Huron Valley for local women to take a proactive step in serving the women of our community. Women Build is supported by local partners, including the James A. & Faith Knight Foundation and the PNC Foundation, as well as many local businesses, organizations and women.

Habitat invites the public to join for build days on Saturday, April 3, 9 AM - 4 PM or Friday, May 21, 9 AM - 4 PM, or help us with home improvement exterior projects for women in our community on Friday, May 7, 9 AM - 1 PM. No construction experience is necessary and COVID-19 Health & Safety Guidelines will be in place.
